








Mission Statement

Box Office

The Box Office is located in the lobby of the Oconomowoc Arts Center at 641 East Forest Street, Oconomowoc, WI 53066. The OAC is adjacent to Oconomowoc High School and is just west of ProHealth Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital.

- In person during regular business hours or 90 minutes before event time.

Ways to Save

The OAC offers discounted tickets for seniors ages 60 and older, military personnel, and youth ages 19 and younger (including infants and toddlers) attending age-appropriate performances. We also offer group rates for groups of 10 or more patrons attending the same performance. These savings apply to OAC professional series shows and may not apply to district or community shows.

Payment/Processing

- In person at the box office: Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, cash, and local checks accepted.
- Over the phone and online: Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express accepted.
- · All service fees and taxes are included in the price of the ticket.
- Mailing your order requires an additional postage and handling fee of \$2.50, or place your order at will
 call for FREE. The box office will not mail tickets less than one week prior to the event.
- Full payment is required on all orders. ALL SALES FINAL. Sorry, no refunds.
- Exchanges are permitted 48 hours prior to event time subject to availability. Exchanges must be for a ticket for the current season or converted to a gift certificate.
- Accessibility to the OAC is available to everyone. Patrons needing special seating or access should call ahead to 262-560-3172. The OAC will provide assistance.
- Hearing impaired patrons may have FREE access to the OAC's FM assisted listening system. Call the box
 office ahead of time to have one reserved. Visually impaired patrons, requiring signing, should call two
 weeks prior to the performance to make arrangements. This is also a FREE service.
- The OAC rarely cancels events due to weather related conditions.

Putting Group Tickets On Hold

A group is defined by 10 or more patrons attending the same performance. If you are ordering tickets for a group and would like to have us hold your reservation for a later date, you may place the order with a 20% nonrefundable deposit or a nonrefundable order of 10 tickets (whichever is greater) based on the group rate ticket price and the total number of tickets you would like to put on hold. When finalizing your group order you may do so over the phone or in person no later than six weeks prior to the date of the event. This offer is not available online and applies to group sales only.

Holds do not apply to special events or any shows in the Little Theater.

Occasionally there may be a misprint within this program guide. We will make every effort to correct the error as soon as possible. We reserve the right to change program schedules as needed to accommodate demand or building use conflicts.

OAC Info

No Food is permitted in the theaters except for beverages sold at the OAC concession stand, with the cap or cover on, or where allowed in the lobby area.

Where Can I Sit?

All 759 seats in the Neudecker Main Stage Theater offer excellent views and acoustics. Our box office can be of service with any questions you may have.



The OAC is ADA compliant. We have a limited number of wheelchair accessible seats. Please let the box office representative know that you will

need accessible seating at the time of purchase. Our circle driveway allows easy drop off and parking that is next to the front entrance. Wheelchair accessible doors and no steps to the front doors make entering and exiting simple. A gradual slope in the theater allows for easy and safe admittance.

The Little Theater is also ADA compliant. Since this space is used for a variety of different set ups from general seating to a cabaret theater, the number of seats depends on the type of show. Again, the box office can answer any questions or aid you with accessibility concerns.

When to Arrive

It is recommended that patrons arrive approximately 20 minutes prior to the start of a performance. This allows for time to park, check your coat (a free service at the OAC), use the restroom, and find your seat without feeling rushed.

Late Arrivals

Out of courtesy to the performers and audience, patrons arriving after the performance has begun will be seated at the discretion of house management – possibly not until intermission.

Seat selection may not be available for patrons purchasing tickets ½ hour prior to performances, and is at the discretion of the box office.

Bringing Children


Patrons are discouraged from bringing any child younger than the age of 6 to performances, unless that particular performance is geared toward or appropriate for younger audiences.

Parents are encouraged to contact the box office for information about the appropriateness of a given performance for younger children.

Booster seats are available. Check with an usher for assistance, first come, first served.

IF YOUR CHILDREN ATTEND A PERFORMANCE WITH YOU, A TICKET WILL NEED TO BE PURCHASED FOR THEM.

This includes children of all ages, including infants and toddlers. PLEASE NOTE: Parents are responsible to supervise their children when in the theater and lobby. If your child is being disruptive or causing a distraction, please take them to the lobby and continue to enjoy the performance on the lobby monitor.





"We play this music using our virtuosity gathered during our 10,000 hours of practice, but with an energy and vibe of our favorite rock and pop stars. Performing is our love and bringing happiness to audiences around the world is our greatest joy," added Deutsch. "We don't take ourselves too seriously and it's not uncommon to see us cracking each other up at our own shows. We can't wait to rock the house and hope we fill every last seat!"



Looking For Fun And Feelin' Groovy

The Oconomowoc Arts Center kicks off its 17th season with **Feelin' Groovy** - a musical journey through the 60s featuring the music of Simon and Garfunkel at 7 p.m. Saturday, September 7!

Last season's **The Piano Men** tribute of Billy Joel and Elton was so popular, we're bringing Jim Witter and his talented band back to the OAC's Main Stage. Get ready to let your hair down and kick off your shoes, as Jim and the boys take a multimedia musical trip back in time to the 1960s.

As the lights go down, and the music begins, close your eyes for a moment. You may almost smell the incense burning and see the lava lamps bubbling. Songs like "Mrs. Robinson," "Scarborough Fair," "The Boxer," and many more made famous by Paul Simon and Art Garfunkel during a time of love, counterculture, and rock 'n roll will have you singing along and feelin' groovy!

It all started in 1957, when the two high school friends had a moderate hit with their song "Hey Schoolgirl." "So many people consider Simon and Garfunkel's music as the soundtrack for what was going on in their lives at that time. I hear all the time about the profound experiences people have with songs like 'Bridge Over Troubled Water.' Every song has special meaning and folks really love the nostalgic trip down memory lane," said Witter.

For more than 30 years, the award-winning Canadian recording artist has been entertaining crowds across Canada, the United States, and the world. Whether sharing his original music, the music of Billy Joel and Elton John, Simon and Garfunkel or any of the other artists he pays tribute to, Witter's versatility as an artist has allowed him the opportunity to connect with audiences of all ages.

The show also features musical talents and pristine vocal harmonies of lan Tanner. The singer-songwriter and multi-instrumentalist has performed in rock bands since the mid-80s, and has been touring the world with Jim Witter and his band for more than 20 years.

"I refer to Ian as a vocal chameleon because he can match his harmonies to whatever I'm singing. He is super talented and our voices really blend well together," added Witter.


