CAPSTONE AP SEMINAR DIGITAL COMMUNICATION Education in a Real-World Environment

Coming to Oconomowoc High School (OHS) during the 2017-2018 school year is a new AP Capstone course titled AP Seminar & Digital Communications. This course is designed to immerse students in an environment that provides a professional work culture, mentorship from local professionals and real world problem solving, in the career fields of the Arts, A/V Technology, and Communications.

The course encourages research, argumentation, and communication skills that are at the core of college and life readiness, such as planning and conducting a study or investigation, proposing solutions to a real-world problem, producing communication in various forms, and collaborating to solve a problem. AP Seminar & Digital Communications will blend digital technology and literature to create research-based multimedia expeditions. Students will learn to synthesize information from different sources, develop their own lines of reasoning in researchbased essays, and deliver oral and visual multimedia presentations.

This is the first course at OHS to utilize innovative Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS) programming, a professional-based learning curriculum. OHS teachers Mr. Michael Krill and Ms. Danielle Bukal have been working to build relationships with local businesses for partnership in curriculum design, project sponsorship, site hosting, mentorship, and guest teaching to give students an authentic professional learning experience.

The CAPS model, stemming out of the Center for Advanced Professional Studies in Blue Valley Kansas City, blends industry and academics for a true college and career readiness program. Programs like this help students better prepare for the expectations and demands of college or a career, further our district goal of being an unrivaled learning community and empower our staff and students as learners and leaders.

In addition to the professional-based learning, students will have the opportunity to earn AP credit as the Digital Communications class is paired with the AP class called AP Seminar. Last summer OHS was accepted into the AP Capstone program, and this summer OHS will be recognized as one of only fourteen schools in the state of Wisconsin to offer this new AP program opportunity.

What a busy and successful school year we just completed! The end of the year is a time when students in all of our schools receive recognition for all of their hard work and accomplishments. Nowhere were those celebrations in greater abundance over the last few weeks than at Oconomowoc High School, where members of the class of 2017 were honored for their successes over the past four years. This group of 391 graduates have distinguished themselves well in the classroom, in the Arts, and on the athletic fields, and have set a high bar for future graduates.

Earlier this month, the class of 2017 brought home approximately \$4 million in scholarships at the Senior Honors Awards Program in recognition of their efforts and achievements. Thank you to all of our local donors, the Oconomowoc Area Foundation, and the Oconomowoc Scholarship Fund for their continued generous support of our students. Congratulations to Jessica Steckling who was named Valedictorian, and Tanner Hallett, who was named Salutatorian. State of Wisconsin Academic Excellence Scholarships were awarded to Alexander Carter, Sarah Foyer, Tanner Hallett, and Jessica Steckling. Wisconsin Technical Excellence Awards recipients were Dylan Andrzejewski, Daniel Kingston, Jack Kraemer, and Alexia Reals.

The Class of 2017 took a total of 225 Advanced Placement Exams during their senior year. In addition, these seniors also took 114 International Baccalaureate Exams this spring. Combined these are the highest number of exams taken by any graduating class at Oconomowoc High School. This year 7 graduates were full IB diploma candidates which will award them with significant college credit, potentially up to one full year, depending on the college or university they attend. In addition, 7 students were awarded an IB Career Programme certificate for their successful completion of a rigorous combination of IB and Project Lead the Way pre-engineering coursework.

90% of the class of 2017 plans to attend a two-year or four-year college. We will have graduates attending colleges across the country with an emphasis on business, the sciences, engineering, education, and the visual and performing arts. Seven graduates have made the brave and honorable commitment to serve our country in the military. Six students from the class of 2017 received athletic scholarships to compete at the collegiate level.

This is a group of young men and women who has, without question, left quite a legacy at Oconomowoc High School and I am confident they will continue to grow as learners and leaders. Congratulations and best wishes to the class of 2017!

Summer Projects Moving Forward



IXONIA ELEMENTARY

The Ixonia Elementary School Ground Breaking event took place on Friday, May 19, 2017, at Ixonia Elementary. OASD staff, parents and community members joined in the festivities, acknowledgements and student participation. Bids for the project came in slightly under budget, and the OASD School Board approved an overall guaranteed maximum price (GMP) of \$8,166,172. Construction began on June 9, 2017, and the estimated project completion date has been set for August 2018.



The project will include:

- Relocating three classrooms from the basement to the main level
- Renovation of existing classroom spaces
- Replacing heating, ventilation and mechanical systems
- Replacing portions of the roof
- Building a visible and secure main entrance
- Building a dedicated cafeteria
- Adding a cooling system

PROJECT UPDATE

Construction documents were completed for both projects and bids were solicited in early April. Bids came in \$600,000 under the pre-referendum budget and the OASD School Board approved a GMP of \$3,147,662 for Park Lawn Elementary School, and \$3,278,389 for Greenland Elementary School. Work at both schools began at the conclusion of the school year and projects will be completed in mid-August 2017.

The project will include:

- Replacement of the heating, ventilation, and mechanical systems in both schools
- Adding a cooling system

MEADOW VIEW ELEMENTARY

Schematic design for the new Meadow View Elementary School began in mid-February. This design phase will result in a floor plan and building exterior designs that will be completed for School Board approval in June. At its March 8th meeting, the school board approved the purchase of 2.18 acres of land from St. Matthews Church, which completes the new school site off of Hwy P/Brown Street.

Elementary Mathematical Instructional Practices Move to Bridges in Mathematics for Grades 4K- 5 Beginning Fall of 2017-18

As part of OASD's commitment to continuous improvement, the district elementary mathematics leadership committee spent the 2016-17 school year reviewing our mathematics instructional practices and curriculum resources. The committee is comprised of 45 teachers, representing all grade levels and buildings. While our district has much to celebrate when analyzing mathematics achievement data, our teacher-led committee continued to find content gaps related to procedural fluency and conceptual understanding within our current instructional resource: Everyday Mathematics. The committee reviewed multiple instructional resources through the lens of a rubric centered on best practices in mathematics (developed by the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics).

Following multiple site visits to neighboring districts utilizing each of our prospective vendors, the mathematics committee



recommended the selection of Bridges in Mathematics as our core instructional resources for 4K-5 beginning fall of 2017-18. Bridges in Mathematics is currently utilized in many high performing districts, including local districts Elmbrook and Menomonee Falls.

"I'm proud of the process we followed to analyze our strengths and weaknesses as a system. Our teachers took ownership within this process and were determined to select core materials that would bring out the best in student learning.", said John Flannery, OASD Director of Curriculum & Instruction. "We look forward to a summer of learning, planning, and implementing best practices so that our students are experiencing an even more engaging and challenging math curriculum in the fall."

Nature Hill Intermediate

Thanks to a lot of hard work by Nature Hill Intermediate (NHI) eighth graders the school will have a new outdoor classroom at the start of the 2017-18 school year. The project team put together a survey to gather feedback from students and staff, developed a plan and presented to the OASD Superintendent Roger Rindo, NHI staff and students, the district's Director of Buildings and Grounds,
