

Capstone AP Programs Launch at OHS during the 2017-18 School Year

New learning opportunities for students are ramping up at Oconomowoc High School (OHS) this fall. Programs in Project Lead the Way, High School of Business, and the Center for Advanced Professional Studies (CAPS) are offering students a chance to explore career pathways in the areas of Health Services, Business, and Arts A/V Communication Technologies.

Project Lead the Way has been developing a new curriculum pathway called Biomedical Science for several years. The first two of four classes are being offered this fall (Principles of Biomedical Science and Human Body Systems) allowing students an opportunity to explore biological concepts through the “death” of a fictional character, forensic anthropology and the interactions of the human body’s systems.

The OHS business and marketing departments are implementing High School of Business courses starting this semester. Two classes (of six total) will be running during the 2017-18 school year. Principles of Business offers students a chance to see what it takes to run a business. Students will develop a biography of a local business during the first project of this course.

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK BUILDING AN UNRIVALED LEARNING COMMUNITY

This September we welcomed 5,280 students back for the start of the 2017-18 school year. Joining us to welcome our students back were 34 new teachers across the district. There is nothing like the excitement and optimism that a new year brings, and we are thrilled to have these talented new faculty and staff as part of the OASD.

Many new and exciting things are in place for 2017-18. The renovation projects at Greenland and Park Lawn Elementary were completed over the summer. These projects, which replaced the heating, ventilation, and mechanical systems and added cooling systems, were funded as a part of the successful referendum last November.

At the elementary level this year we are implementing Bridges in Mathematics, our new comprehensive K-5 Math program. Nearly 50 elementary teachers worked last year to review possible new materials and overwhelmingly selected Bridges. Elementary faculty spent sixteen hours this summer training to implement these new materials in preparation for the start of the school year, and we look forward to evaluating the learning impact of this new program.

Also new this year is Personal Finance as a high school graduation requirement. Students will learn about budgeting, banking, credit, insurance, taxes, saving and investing, and the financial decisions that they will face as they move into life past high school. Students will leave this course with relevant strategies to make sound financial decisions in the future. We are excited and happy to be partnering with area businesses as a part of this new course.

Throughout the K-8 level, Fundamentals of Grammar has been added as a component of Readers and Writers Workshop. This addition to our comprehensive literacy program addresses a need, based on gaps in student performance in English over time. The focus is on the conventions of English grammar, usage, and mechanics within the context of reading and writing.

Finally, our first capstone course at OHS kicks off this fall. Taught through an interdisciplinary approach, Advanced Placement Seminar Digital Communication will help students understand the connections between course content and their practical applications in the workforce. Throughout the year, students will be engaged in authentic, professional tasks created in partnership with local businesses. We are looking forward to seeing some of the work our students produce for our business partners.

This District is a special place, with a faculty, staff, and administration committed to helping every child succeed. At the same time, we recognize that schools alone cannot prepare children to be future leaders. That is a partnership shared with the community, and we are fortunate in Oconomowoc to have a community that takes that partnership so seriously. We are grateful for that continued support and look forward to an excellent year of learning and growth in 2017-18.



OCONOMOWOC PUBLIC EDUCATION FOUNDATION

The Oconomowoc Public Education Foundation (OPEF) is dedicated to encouraging leadership, fostering excellence, and nurturing community in the Oconomowoc public schools. OPEF raises and provides funds for innovative educational opportunities and experiences not funded in the core school district budget. OPEF is led by a volunteer Board of Directors that consults with, but operates independently from, the OASD Board of Education.

OPEF has given over \$370,000 for classroom grants since 2007, including the 2017-2018 grant, Flexible Piano Lab at Nature Hill Intermediate School. Tracy Garon, Music Educator at NHI, noted, "We are so grateful to the Oconomowoc Public Education Foundation for funding our Flexible Piano Lab Grant, which will impact over 500 students throughout our music department and allow non-music students another opportunity to join the pack through a Keyboard Club."



The 2017 summer months were busy for OASD facility projects!



MEADOW VIEW ELEMENTARY

The OASD School Board approved initial schematic designs for the new Meadow View Elementary School at their June 20, 2017, meeting, then reviewed these initial exterior schematic designs at their July 18, 2017, meeting. The City of Oconomowoc also received its Notice of Intent permit from the DNR in July, allowing the site work that began in August. Initial site paving is set to be completed in early November, 2017, while the design development and construction document phase of the project continues through the spring of 2018, prior to the public bidding and construction phases.

OHS: EAST & MAIN CAMPUS

The OASD School Board approved initial schematic designs for the OHS Main and East Campus projects at their July 18, 2017, meeting. The presentation included designs like these, for the café/gathering space at OHS East Campus. The design development and construction document phase will continue through the fall before public bidding and construction begins in December 2017/January 2018.



GREENLAND/ PARK LAWN ELEMENTARY

The Greenland and Park Lawn Elementary projects are complete and both included:

- Replacement of the heating, ventilation and mechanical systems
- Adding cooling systems
- Partial roof replacement and repair



IXONIA ELEMENTARY

Ixonia Elementary looks much different than it did in June. Exterior excavation is complete, the footings and poured walls for the new addition are complete, and structural steel installation has begun. The interior of Ixonia Elementary underwent asbestos abatement this summer and a new temporary main entrance and ramp were added to the building for student, staff and family use during construction.

A time-lapse camera was installed, to view still photos of the construction progress at Ixonia Elementary.

District Wide Sustainability Challenge Adds Up to Real and Valuable Savings



OASD Elementary Schools Introduce Seesaw District-Wide

This year, OASD 4K- grade 4 classrooms will be using an interactive digital tool called Seesaw to support the district's dedication to providing families with timely and relevant feedback on individual student learning. After a successful initial pilot program last year in various classrooms, Seesaw was chosen as a tool to increase classroom communication with families and develop individual student learning portfolios at each elementary site.

Michele Koper, Coordinator of Continuous Improvement and Innovation explained, "Seesaw is a tool that enables families to connect with the classroom and their child in a meaningful way. Individual students will use this platform to document their learning and progress over time. We are excited about the opportunities it will give students to take ownership of their learning, demonstrate growth, and involve families along the way."

There has been a lot of excitement and activity in schools this fall around the capabilities of Seesaw. The ease of use for students, families, and teachers elevates the level of communication by providing a window into classroom daily activities. Families can utilize the Seesaw App, or the website to stay up to date on classroom announcements. The communication features



are interactive, giving families and teachers a seamless way to connect. Students can use any type of device to show their work in the form of pictures, videos, and text. Families are able to easily view and respond to their child's learning artifacts. This allows them to engage in the learning process and be informed about their child's academic growth.

Nature Hill and Silver Lake Intermediate Students Travel Globally to Serve Others

A group of Oconomowoc Area School District intermediate students and staff had a life changing experience, traveling to the Dominican Republic in June, 2017. The trip was part of the Service Learning Program, open to all intermediate students in the district. The group worked with local residents from a rural town to plant 5,000 mahogany seeds, move over 7,000 pounds of dirt, harvest potato-like roots from the rain forest, and plant a sustainable garden. Working together on meaningful projects inspired students to become a family with a mission of helping others. When they weren't working, they visited Paradise Island, snorkeled in the Atlantic Ocean, braved whitewater rapids, and experienced Dominican style dancing.

They were touched by the kindness and caring of the Dominican people, and everyone returned with gratitude for fresh water, electricity, and many blessings experienced on a daily basis in the United States.



Student travelers presented their experiences to the Rotary Club, Kiwanis Club, and Nature Hill Intermediate teaching staff. One audience member remarked, "What a bright and articulate group of students. They were well prepared, well spoken, self-confident, and great ambassadors for the school district and our community. This is such important and meaningful work with our kids."

Welcome, Coach Benish! We are thrilled to have you join the OASD School Community!




Winter Indoor Running/Walking Times at OHS Fieldhouse


